Swift, Certain, and Fair (SCF) Supervision Program: Applying the Principles Behind Project HOPE

This program provides community supervision agencies with information, resources, and technical assistance to improve their responses to the behavior of adults on supervision improve supervision outcomes and reduce recidivism. The selected agencies will engage in collaborative problem solving with stakeholders and use data and research-informed strategies to respond to behavior in a way that individuals will connect to their actions, and not see as a function of supervision, per se.

County governments, Native American tribal governments (Federally recognized), State governments, Other: State, city, township, county, or tribal government acting directly or through agreements with other public or private entities on behalf of a single drug court.

- Develop supervision strategies based on the Swift, Certain Fair principles.
- Use a data-driven process to identify a target population.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of the strategies to reduce recidivism and improve outcomes for individuals under community supervision.
